

ICDP IN TANZANIA 2019

During 2018 and 2019 we have had limited funds and have not been able to reach out to many families.

However, KIWAKKUKI' experience in service delivery is devoted to people living with HIV and AIDS (PLHA) including children, the orphans and other vulnerable children. During the years 2018 and 2019, we have developed a project in order to support children with HIV and AIDS.

This project is aimed at children under 6 years, who have tested positive with HIV and AIDS. We help them to attend Care and Treatment Clinic (CTC) and on these occasions I invite their parents to attend our ICDP sensitizing course. Parents invariably seem to like the idea very much.

In this way we have reached 160 parents/caregivers and in addition we have provided training and formed 16 people as ICDP facilitators.





Below is the summary of the project and some pictures of one of the ICDP meetings and the children who are supported with bus fare to attend CTC.

The Goal

Support to 80 children 0 – 6 years, who are HIV positive to get bus fares to attend CTC, attain birth certificates and sensitize their parents/caregivers on child development using International Child Development Program (ICDP) Approach to enhance children rights, wellbeing and early learning.

Main Objectives

- 1.** To support children living with HIV and AIDS with bus fares to attend Care and Treatment Clinic (CTC) regularly for one year.
- 2.** To sensitize Parents/Caregivers of young children (0-6 years) on International Child Development Program (ICDP) Approach to assist their children for learning and meet other developmental needs.
- 3.** To provide 40 children from Kilimanjaro Area attain official registration Birth certificates.
